Music at GPC during the month of March celebrates Women's History Month! Fanny Hensel Mendelssohn (1805-1847) was a German composer and pianist of the early Romantic era. Due to social conventions of the time about the roles of women, many of her works were published under her brother Felix's name. Chicago-based composer, pianist, organist, and harpsichordist, Marianne Kim (b. 1972) has been noted for her vibrant performances and compositions in a wide diversity of musical styles, including classical, jazz, Broadway, R&B, and gospel, alongside traditional and contemporary church music.

Where do you go to school? Woodland Presbyterian School.


What's your favorite activity to do outside of church? Playing piano and being a member of the school's robotics team.

Compass at Lent



Pastor Mike is leading a 4-week Compass Lenten series in Warren Fellowship Hall titled *The Last 4 Days of Jesus' Life* from March 16 – April 6. The meal will begin at 5:30 (\$8 for adults, \$5 for kids ages 6-12, kids under 5 eat free, \$25 family rate), and the study will begin at 6. Pastor Mike will be using Mark's Gospel as his text, so there's nothing to buy. Just bring your Bible!

The meal this week will be pork tenderloin, broccoli medley, roasted potatoes, corn, salad, rolls, ambrosia, Oreo cookie cake, and lemon whipped cream cake.

<u>The flowering cross</u> is found in Christian art as early as the sixth century and is based on a legend that says that the cross itself burst into bloom at the moment that Jesus died. The legend of the True Cross describes how the wood of the cross came from a tree that sprang from a seed taken from the Tree of Life in the Garden of Eden.

In spite of its function as a brutal form of execution, the cross stands at the center of our faith as a symbol of life. There can be no Easter without Good Friday, no Resurrection without the Crucifixion. Indeed, the cross, rather than the empty tomb, has held the place of honor as the primary symbol of the Christian faith.

A modern expression of this idea may be found in the custom of flowering the cross. On Easter morning, flowers are used to decorate a cross. So, on Easter Sunday, please bring flowers of any kind and place them on the cross in the church yard near the Arthur Road entry. Since it will be conveniently placed for access, this is a great opportunity for everyone - old, young, and in between - to participate and take photos of their families. Let our flowering cross celebrate the beauty of God's creation, glorify Him, give thanks for His many blessings, and honor the new life Christ's sacrifice upon the cross has given us.
