# Worship Arts Notes

In celebration of Black History Month, music during the month of February will feature contributions to the sacred music repertoire by African-American composers. In addition to the two popular spirituals being sung today, we draw your attention to the instrumental selections for the day. Florence Beatrice Price (1887-1953), born in Little Rock, Arkansas, was the first African-American woman to have her music performed by a major symphony orchestra. William Grant Still (1895-1978), often referred to as the "Dean of Afro American Composers," was an important part of the Harlem Renaissance, which highlighted and celebrated African American intellectual, social, and artistic contributions to American cultural life.






### Memphis Spring 2023 Emmaus Walks Men: February 16-19 (Thu-Sun) Women: March 2-5 (Thu-Sun)

The Walk to Emmaus is a spiritual renewal program intended to strengthen the local church through the development of Christian disciples and leaders. The Walk to Emmaus experience begins with a 72-hour short course in Christianity, comprised of fifteen talks by lay and clergy on the themes of God's grace, disciplines of Christian discipleship, and what it means to be the

church. The course is wrapped in prayer and meditation, special times of worship and daily celebration of Holy Communion. The "Emmaus Community," made up of those who have attended an Emmaus weekend, supports the 72-hour experience with a prayer vigil, by preparing and serving meals, and other acts of love and self-giving. The Emmaus Walk usually begins Thursday evening and concludes Sunday evening. Men and women attend separate weekends.
