Ivy served as mayor of San Antonio, Texas for three years and as a member of the San Antonio City Council for five years. Taylor obtained a bachelor's degree in American Studies in 1992 from Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut, a master's degree in City and Regional Planning in 1998 from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and a doctorate in education from the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia in 2020

In celebration of Black History Month, music during the month of February will feature contributions to the sacred music repertoire by black composers. Samuel Coleridge-Taylor (1875-1912) was an English composer and conductor. Of mixed-race birth, Coleridge-Taylor achieved such success that he was referred to by white New York musicians as the "African Mahler" when he had three tours of the United States in the early 1900s.

Memphis Spring 2023 Emmaus Walks

Men: February 16-19 (Thu-Sun) Women: March 2-5 (Thu-Sun)

The Walk to Emmaus is a spiritual renewal program intended to strengthen the local church through the development of Christian disciples and leaders. The Walk to Emmaus experience begins with a 72-hour short course in Christianity, comprised of fifteen talks by lay and clergy on the themes of God's grace, disciplines of Christian discipleship, and what it means to be the

church. The course is wrapped in prayer and meditation, special times of worship and daily celebration of Holy Communion. The "Emmaus Community," made up of those who have attended an Emmaus weekend, supports the 72-hour experience with a prayer vigil, by preparing and serving meals, and other acts of love and self-giving. The Emmaus Walk usually begins Thursday evening and concludes Sunday evening. Men and women attend separate weekends.

How it works: Hosts decide the number of guests they would like to invite and prepare a dinner party.


Guests find out who their host is the day of the event, and hosts find out who their guests are as they arrive.
