



Over 40 gathered on the afternoon of Sunday, December 17 and traveled out for Christmas caroling at GPC members' homes and retirement communities!










New Year, New Me?

So why would anyone want to play a game with a funny sounding name like Pickleball?

As an aerobic activity, it improves cardiovascular health, improves muscle strength, and burns calories. Because it is a low-impact sport, it focuses on balance and agility while carrying a lower risk of injury compared to other similar games such as tennis. So, many people take it up to get exercise and stay fit.

But exercise may not be the greatest benefit this game has

to offer. The informal atmosphere of play lends to conversation during and between games leading to camaraderie and friendliness, rather than competitiveness. This can result in a pickleball community which can be a welcoming environment for all participants. It's a sport that is accessible to all ages, all fitness levels, and doesn't require a large financial investment to start playing. Just search for "pickleball" on YouTube and you'll find many videos that show just how much fun it is to play.



LOCAL MISSION: BINGHAMPTON CHRISTIAN ACADEMY (BCA)

In December, a group of GPC women visited Binghampton Christian Academy for a Christmas party. The women at the party are committed to praying for a specific child from this Kindergarten class for this school year. Our class has 16 children and we have 16 people who have agreed to pray daily for a child. We have about 5-6 other volunteers who pray for the class as a whole and who come and help with the four parties we host each year. At these parties we match up with our prayer partner and do the activities and games. This enables us to get to know the child for which we are praying. We started with this class last year and will follow them through 8th grade. Sometimes prayer partners have to be replaced but the goal is to have one GPC member praying for and bonding with one student for the students entire career at the school.

We have also developed a relationship with BCA through various other projects, including a book drive (in conjunction with the Library Committee), a coat drive and planned visits, such as this one. It is a joyful opportunity to interact with the children and to demonstrate the Christian values of love and giving. And in turn, there is great reward for the volunteers through the love and appreciation that is given back.

BCA is a important part of our local mission. Memphis, throughout it's history, has had a higher than average rate of poverty. The results of which have led to many that are food and shelter insecure. As this cycle continues, we see many youth that are unable to escape the spiral.

BCA is trying to break that cycle by providing a high-quality education to its young students. But it is a community effort. GPC plays a part in supporting the students, teachers, and administrators in their efforts.
