

And he calls through the ages, "Come, follow me." I will follow the Master where e'er he may lead.



In celebration of Black History Month, we proudly feature contributions to the sacred music repertoire by Black composers during the month of February. Composer, musician and music publisher William Christopher Handy (1873-1958) was born in Florence, Alabama. Better known by his initials "W. C." he came to be known as the "father of the blues." In 1938, Handy published his own collection of spirituals, and a year later the New York World's Fair named him a leading contributor to American culture.

Composer and organist D. L. White (b. 1930) is a native of Los Angeles. He has served various Baptist and AME congregations throughout his life.


